(1) "Cap	ital," transit vehicles and related equipment and structures having a useful life
expectancy of c	one or more years;
(2) "Dep	artment," the South Dakota Department of Transportation;
(3) "Disa	abilities," physical or mental impairments which substantially limit one or more major
life activities, s	uch as:
(a) Se	elf-care;
(b) Re	eceptive and expressive language;
(c) Le	earning;
(d) M	obility;
(e) Se	elf-direction;
(f) Ca	spacity for independent living; and
(g) Ec	conomic or social self sufficiency;
(4) "Disc	eretionary," administrative actions not mandated by laws or rules;
( <del>5</del> <u>3</u> ) "Dis	spatcher," a person who assigns transit drivers and transit vehicles to specific travel
routes during sp	pecific time periods on specific days;
(6) "Elde	erly," persons 60 years of age or older;
(7 <u>4</u> ) "Fix	ked route," a specific route over which bus service is provided during specific time
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- (85) "FTA," the Federal Transit Administration, United States Department of Transportation;
- (96) "Grant," a written award to an eligible grantee for a specific amount of funds to carry out specific activities for a specific time period;
- (7) "Grant administration performance," an evaluation of a grantee's implementation of and compliance with grant requirements, participation in transit training, and service to transit organizations and associations.
- (108) "Intercity bus service," regularly scheduled bus service for the general public which operates with limited stops over fixed routes connecting two or more municipalities, which has the capacity for transporting baggage carried by passengers, and which makes connections with scheduled intercity bus service to more distant points when such service is available;
- (9) "Local funding," funding eligible to be considered local match in accordance with FTA requirements;
- (1110) "Operating expenses," costs related to transit vehicle operations, including drivers' and dispatchers' salaries and fringe benefits, gasoline, oil, engine repairs, and vehicle maintenance expenses;
- (12) "Paratransit," unscheduled public transit services, usually serving persons with disabilities, which operate by passenger request and not on a fixed bus route with a fixed schedule of service;
- (1311) "Passenger trip," the point from which the passenger enters the transit vehicle to the destination point where the passenger leaves the transit vehicle;
- (14) "Percentage grant," the percent that the department will pay of the total cost of the purchase price of a transit capital item;
- (1512) "Public transit transportation," the transporting of persons from one location to another location for a fee in a transit vehicle open to the general public or open to a segment of the general public defined by age, disability, or low income;

(16) "Revenues," the fare, fee, or donation made by a transit vehicle passenger to pay for a

passenger trip, generally known in the transit industry as farebox revenues;

(1713) "Rural area," eities that have an area encompassing a population of less than 50,000

persons people that has not been designated in the most recent decennial census as an urbanized area

by the Secretary of the United States Department of Commerce;

(18) "Special transit," the transporting of persons from one location to another for a fee or

donation in a vehicle primarily serving the elderly and persons with disabilities;

(1914) "Transit," the transporting of persons from one location to another in a vehicle for a

fee public transportation;

(20) "Transit administration," the management of a rural public transit organization funded

under 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1614 as in effect on March 1, 1993;

(2115) "Transit administration expenses," salaries and fringe benefits for administrative,

secretarial, building maintenance, and fiscal staffs and costs necessary to acquire and maintain

administrative office spaces, insurance policies, and related office equipment and supplies;

(2216) "Urban Urbanized area," cities that have an area encompassing a population of not less

than 50,000 persons or more people that has been defined and designated in the most recent decennial

census as an urbanized area by the Secretary of the United States Department of Commerce;

(2317) "User-side subsidies," the partial funding of the price of a transit fare for an individual

rider:

(2418) "Vehicle miles driven," the numerical changes in a transit vehicle's odometer over a

specific period of time.

Grantees receiving the following federal transit grants are eligible for state matching funds from the

public and special transportation assistance state highway fund:

(1) Discretionary grants for capital purchases as authorized under 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix

§ 1602(a), as in effect on March 1, 1993;

(21) Urban public transit grants for capital purchases and operating expenses as authorized

under 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1607a, as in effect on March 1, 1993 § 5307;

(3) Transit capital purchases for transit organizations serving elderly persons and persons with

disabilities as authorized under 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1612(b) as in effect on March 1, 1993, and

under 42 U.S.C.S. § 3030d, as in effect on March 1, 1993; and

(42) Rural public area transit grants for eapital purchases, operating costs, expenses and transit

administration expenses as authorized under 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1614, as in effect on March 1,

(4) Nonprofit Private nonprofit corporations providing services primarily for elderly persons

or persons with disabilities.; and

(5) State agencies.

70:06:02:01. Award and Administration of federal transit grants. The department may award and shall administer federal transit grants in accordance with federal requirements. Before receiving a federal transit grant administered by the department, the grantee shall execute a grant agreement with the department in a form satisfactory to the department.

70:06:02:01 70:06:02:02. Criteria used to award state matching funds. The department shall use the following criteria to award state matching funds to the eligible grantees listed in § 70:06:01:03:

- (1) Discretionary transit capital grantees, as defined by 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1602(a), as in effect on March 1, 1993, may be awarded a state percentage grant to be used as part of the total capital purchase or purchases;
- (2) Urban transit grantees, as defined by 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1607a, as in effect on March 1, 1993, A grantee receiving a grant authorized by 49 U.S.C. § 5307 may be awarded a state matching

grants grant based on the grantee's share of the total urban urbanized area population within South

Dakota, which is 347,768 as determined by the most recent United States census;

(32) Transit capital grants for transit organization grantees, as defined by 49 U.S.C.S.

Appendix § 1612(b), as in effect on March 1, 1993, and by 42 U.S.C.S. § 3030d, as in effect on

March 1, 1993, primarily serving elderly persons and persons with disabilities, may be awarded a

state percentage grant to be used as part of their total capital purchase or purchases; Grantees

receiving grants authorized by 49 U.S.C. § 5311 may be awarded a state matching fund grant based

on factors including number of passenger trips provided, vehicle miles driven, transit administration

expenses, operating expenses, grant administration performance, and level of local funding. At least

annually, the department shall obtain commission approval of objective scoring procedures for

determining grant awards pursuant to this subsection.

(4) Rural public transit grantees, as defined by 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix §§ 1614, as in effect on

March 1, 1993, may be awarded state matching funds based on the following three criteria:

— (a) Annual transit vehicle miles driven by each grantee;

(b) Annual number of passenger trips provided by each grantee; and

(c) Annual amount of local revenues and local funds expended by each grantee;

(5) Public transit grantees, as defined by 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1614, as in effect on March

1, 1993, and 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1607a, as in effect on March 1, 1993, may be awarded increases

for their original federal grants for the purposes of offsetting the costs of the following:

(a) Inflation;

(b) Shortages in federal fund allocations to the department; and

(c) Paratransit services.

in conjunction with the primary federal grants grant. Eligible grantees which are awarded FTA

transit grants directly by FTA shall submit copies of the FTA grant award document to the

department with a request for state matching grants. Request forms may be obtained from Grant

applications must be made on forms approved by the department. The department may establish

deadlines for application submission. The department shall approve in whole or in part or deny a

request within 45 days after the department's receipt of a completed request form.

eligible for funding under federal transit grants as authorized by 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1614(i), as

in effect on June 1, 1993 § 5311(f):

(1) Planning and marketing for intercity bus transportation;

(2) Capital grants for intercity bus shelters, joint-use structures, depots, and transit vehicles;

(3) Operating grants for intercity bus transportation;

(4) Coordination of rural area connections between small transit operators and intercity bus

operators; and

(5) User-side subsidies.

to award grants to providers of intercity bus services:

(1) The total number of vehicle miles driven and passengers served during the last operating

year on regularly scheduled fixed routes by bus services which are open to the general public and

operated by the grant applicant within South Dakota. No charter or tour mileages may be included;

(2) Annual operating losses on regularly scheduled, fixed-route intercity bus services within

South Dakota, documented by a complete description of the intercity services provided and

verification by an independent certified public accountant of the grant applicant's most recent

financial statement;

(3) The total number of passengers served on regularly scheduled fixed routes within South

Dakota during the last operating year provider's proposed budget for operating expenses and transit

administration expenses in the upcoming federal fiscal year; and

(4) Circular FTA C 9040.1<del>C</del>G, Chapter <del>VII</del> VIII, dated November <del>3, 1992</del> <u>24, 2014</u>, issued

by FTA to implement 49 U.S.C.S. Appendix § 1614(i), as in effect June 1, 1993 § 5311(f).

The department may award additional funds to projects which expand intercity bus service to

currently unserved areas of South Dakota or which support intercity bus services routes in immediate

danger of abandonment.

part or may deny the proposal application after the department's review of a completed proposal

form pursuant to § 70:06:04:02.

periodic reimbursement of prior expenditures by grantees. Grantees must provide the department

with federal performance and fiscal reports as required by 49 C.F.R. Part 18, Uniform Administrative

Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments, Subpart C,

Post-Award Requirements, § 18.20 (October 1, 1992). Grantees must permit auditors of the

department to obtain and review all expenditure records related to intercity bus service grants.
