President Nelson called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm CDT. Attendee introductions were completed. The Appointed Committee members met to discuss the Board of Pharmacy's proposed rule changes to chapter 20:51:28 - Administration of Immunization. The Executive Director reviewed registered pharmacists' current authority as defined in SDCL 36-11-19.1 which was previously approved by two persons (the Advisory Committee) from each of the forementioned agencies above as established in 36-11-1-.1.(1).

The floor was opened to discuss the removal of the notation "influenza" from 20:51:28:01 in order to establish a pharmacist's authority to order and provide all CDC/ACIP recommended immunizations and in addition that pharmacists be allowed to immunize all individuals three years of age and older to mirror the activities allowed under the PREP Act which will be expiring at the end of 2024.

There was much discussion regarding the board's statutory authority / basis to take action to promulgate rules regarding immunization especially if the board were to repeal 20:51:28:01.01 (Authority to administer immunizations) as it proposed. Committee members expressed no concerns regarding the proposed rule changes per se. It was suggested that the board consider taking steps to put forth a statute change establishing the board's authority instead of a rule change. No action was taken today.

A motion was made to move forward with proposed rule changes if LCR approved. And, if LCR requires revisions a follow-up meeting will occur. (Laetsch/Sterling/unanimous)

STATE PRIORITIES AND INITIATIVES

PREPARING FOR THE 99TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION

SDPhA has been diligently preparing for the 99th Legislative Session which kicks off Jan. 2, 2024. Although at this point, we do not anticipate bringing any legislation, we do anticipate a busy session – one again with several health-related issues, and some of consequence to the profession.

HB 1135 IN ACTION

With HB 1135 now the law in South Dakota, our focus for now is on assessing how it works in practical application for regulating Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs). In the months that followed HB 1135 becoming law, SDPhA went to work with the South Dakota Division of Insurance (SD DOI) on the process and procedure for filing complaints and violations of the new law. We thank the DOI for bringing us to the table early and often in this process. We worked with them to create an intake form that is simple and direct, yet comprehensive.

As a reminder, here are the highlights of the bill:

- **Prohibit direct or indirect retroactive claim adjustments** unless it's the result of a technical billing error, audit, fraudulent or duplicate claim. (Section 13)
- Prohibit the numerous onerous fees PBMs charge pharmacies. (Section 14)
- MAC list regulation to help ensure pharmacies are paid fairly and transparently. (Sections 15-16)
- Prohibit a PBM from reimbursing its own pharmacies more than it does other resident South Dakota pharmacies (Section 17)
- Strengthens gag clause prohibition (Section 10)

In addition, the bill strengthens audit (Section 4, 7) and reporting (Section 18) requirements for PBMs (including identifying all instances of spread spicing) and establishes the conditions under which the Division of Insurance may suspend, revoke, or deny a PBM's license (Section 19).

One very important note – it is incumbent upon us to report issues and they occur and provide the proper documentation regarding. Complaints need to be reported IN WRITING via the form. A phone call to the DOI is not going to initiate the process. The Division has also hired an investigator and a pharmacist, but the process is new for everyone, and we are committed to taking the time to work through any issues that arise with the process as we go. You can find a link to the complaint form, and a host of other resources on our new webpage devoted exclusively to PBM and Payer Resources.

SDPHA GENERAL AND C&L FUNDS

Earlier this year, South Dakota licensed pharmacists received an email with a survey which contained several questions as they relate to a bill the South Dakota Board of Pharmacy (SD BOP) intends to bring forward regarding fee increases to address budget constraints. The second business meeting at this year's convention saw a fair amount of discussion on the bill, and its potential impact on SDPhA.

If you are a licensed pharmacist in South Dakota, you are a member of SDPhA. Here's why: years ago, the SD BOP and the Association were run out of the same office, by the same executive. When the offices separated, the funding mechanism for the association became essentially what we know now – that a portion of the pharmacist renewal fees may go to the association. That's detailed in SDCL <u>36-11-6</u>.

It's very important to note that the bill the BOP is asking to move forward doesn't change that. The board is not moving to strike that section. It's also important to note that once the chapter is open, it will take diligence to avoid an unintended consequence.

Funds that come to SDPhA through licensure fees to go into the SDPhA General fund and are used in accordance with our obligations outlined in SDCL 36-11-6. Primarily this includes the day-to-day operation of the association, continuing education, and the Health Professionals Assistance Program.

These funds are not to be used for lobbying, which is why we maintain those monies separately, in the Commercial and Legislative (C&L) Fund. The C&L Fund sustains the work of the C&L Branch of the Association. It is the lobbying arm of SDPhA.

Lobbying is an extremely expensive, but necessary function. We have been represented by the same firm for decades, and the executive director also performs many lobbying duties. That has all kept our rate extremely low. Before the past two years, our lobbying expenses typically totaled about \$12,000 per year. Even then, expenses far outpaced contributions.

For the past few years, we have needed additional lobbyists, which means expenses have increased dramatically. We have spent an average of \$33,000/year for the past two years. Those costs will only continue to increase, yet they remain far below the going rate for most lobbyists. As we continue to work through PBM and other significant issues, we foresee the need to move forward with all four lobbyists in an effort to protect the profession.

The reality is, to ensure the profession has a seat at the table, first and foremost, the Association needs the funds in the general fund to even exist. Second, we must have the funds in the C&L Fund to pay for the chair. Thus far (5 months) into the 2023-2024 fiscal year, contributions are minimal. Simply put, we need your help. \$25, \$250, \$2,500 — whatever you can contribute will help ensure the profession continues to have representation at the Capitol. Because without your contributions — it simply won't.

Legislative Days is a prime opportunity to do just that. We can't stress enough the impact Legislative Days had on our legislators last year, and if you haven't been here to experience it yourself, mark your calendars, and join us in Pierre!

The event is a fantastic opportunity to show a much broader range of the great work you all do each day. It's also a unique chance for students to hone their skills by providing screenings, while also having the option to sit-in on various committees, and venture onto the House and Senate floors to meet their lawmakers. NATIONAL EFFORTS

PBM INITIATIVES

While SDPhA has obviously been busy working on PBM initiatives here at home, we also continue to engage at the national level as well. There are very few issues for which you will find bipartisan support on Capitol Hill, but reining in PBMs is one of them. We've spent a lot of time engaging with the office of Sen. John Thune R-SD, on this issue. Sen. Thune has played a particularly important role as a member of the Senate Finance Committee, and we appreciate his strong show of support for South Dakota pharmacy. A Nov. 8, 2023 unanimous vote of 26-0 sent the Better Mental Health Care, Lower-Cost Drugs and Extenders Act sailing out of committee.

Key provisions include:

- Requirements for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to define reasonable and relevant contract terms under Medicare Part D and create a process for pharmacies to report contract violations.
- Provisions to give CMS the tools to enforce reasonable and relevant contract requirements.
- Boost oversight of pharmacy benefit managers before the bill is implemented, especially regarding the upcoming DIR hangover.

The legislation would essentially be paired with the provisions of the Modernizing and Ensuring PBM Accountability Act (S. 2973) which passed committee earlier this year. Together it's a significant step toward achieving needed PBM reforms at the federal level. Now that the U.S. House once again has a Speaker, we look forward to continuing our efforts to help get these important initiatives across the finish line. We will continue to keep you posted on these important initiatives and their progress.

FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION PROBE UPDATE

In July, the FTC made a pretty important and somewhat rare move, voting to rescind its prior statements advocating for PBMs. The FTC previously announced it would dig deeper into the issue of PBMs as part of its on-going probe, issuing compulsory orders to two group purchasing organizations (GPOs) – Zinc Health Services, LLC and Ascent Health Services, LLC. GPOs negotiate drug rebates on behalf of other PBMs. The FTC previously issued compulsory orders to the six largest PBMs in the U.S. healthcare industry.

SDPhA, along with many other organizations and individuals from South Dakota (some 24,000 comments were previously submitted), again submitted comments to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) regarding detrimental PBM practices. and previously expressed similar concerns to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) regarding DIR fees and their 2023 proposal.

MEDICARE PROVIDER STATUS

The Equitable Community Access to Pharmacist Services (ECAPS) Act, H.R. 1770/S.2477, was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives. The House legislation currently has 92 cosponsors, and a Congressional Budget Office (CBO) score has now been formally requested. Sen. Thune introduced the Senate version of the bill, with SDPhA's support. It currently has 10 co-sponsors. The bill would enable Medicare patients to receive timely and consistent treatment from pharmacists for pandemic-related health services and would allow pharmacists to respond to ongoing and future public health threats to our nation. It also establishes a federal reimbursement mechanism for pharmacists' services under Medicare Part B.

DIR HANGOVER | CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES

The CMS final rule to, "put an end" to PBMs retroactive DIR fees goes into effect Jan. 1, 2024. The rule requires DIR fees be reflected in the negotiated price the patient pays at the point of sale. So, the rule does not remove DIR fees, but instead moves them to the point-of-sale negotiated price. The fee reform is a huge cashflow shift that will impact pharmacy. The first half of 2024, pharmacists will have to pay their 2023 DIR payments, and CMS will reimburse less during that transition.

In addition, we'd heard from concerned pharmacists who said they were seeing their 2024 contracts and have grave concerns. We'd reached out to Sen. Thune's office looking for any way to provide some relief for South Dakota pharmacies and urged he and his colleagues to reason out to CMS. In response to the many inquiries, CMS issued a memo to all Part D sponsors reminding them that CMS continues to have concerns regarding pharmacy cash flow and contracting challenges ahead of the 2024 DIR changes, and continued to strongly encourage plans and PBMs to provide payment plans or alternate payment arrangements, and a straightforward way to request a payment plan.

This issue part of the reason Sen. Thune joined Sen. Chuck Grassley, R-IA, in an amendment to the Better Mental Health Care, Lower-Cost Drugs and Extenders Act the requiring HHS to report to Congress on their monitoring and enforcement activities related to the changes in DIR regulatory requirements and effects on any willing pharmacy, steering of beneficiaries and terms/payments offered by plans. The goal is to push CMS to monitor issues related to pharmacy access and let them know Congress is paying attention.

PREP ACT AUTHORITIES AND PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY | FEDERAL AND STATE IMPACT

The COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) ended May 11. That ended some of the flexibility the government had for pandemic related efforts and means changes in how some receive COVID-19-related care. The department of Health & Human Services (HHS) announced it would extend certain authorities and corresponding liability protections for pharmacists, technicians, and students authorized under the PREP Act (separate from the PHE) until December 2024. SDPhA signed on to the efforts of many pharmacy organizations requesting the extension of these authorities.

At its March meeting, the South Dakota Board of Pharmacy motioned to direct the board to work on Rules to make PREP Act authorization permanent for South Dakota. While that rules package is now on hold, SDPhA looks forward to working with the Board of Pharmacy on this process as appropriate.

ADDITIONAL ADVOCACY EFFORTS

SDPhA also remains engaged in a variety of ways in other various additional national efforts on key topics directly impacting our pharmacists such as: COVID-19 advocacy, provider status, reproductive health care, pricing transparency, DSCSA, improvements to Medicare, prescription drug misuse and abuse, biologics and biosimilars, and compounding guidance.

2023/2024 INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION RESOURCES

CDC CAMPAIGN/RESOURCES

Seasonal flu activity is increasing across the country, and in South Dakota. Yearly flu vaccines remain of the utmost importance this year. The CDC kicked off its annual campaign at the end of September, and has excellent resources available at cdc.gov/flu/. This website has a great deal of information for Health Professionals and patients alike. Recommendations by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) for the use of influenza vaccine are now updated for 2023/2024 and are available here.

The South Dakota Department of Health's flu website contains an <u>updated dashboard</u> and helpful statistics and pertinent information.

In addition to the important role that health care providers play in recommending influenza vaccination for their patients, influenza vaccination of health care personnel is important to protect themselves, their patients, their family, and the community from influenza. The FDA urges health care organizations to encourage their members to get vaccinated.

NATIONAL INFLUENZA VACCINATION WEEK

NIVW is a national observance that was established to highlight the importance of continuing influenza vaccination, as well as fostering greater use of flu vaccine after the holiday season into January and beyond. NIVW is December 4-8.

NATIONAL AND STATE MEETINGS

SOUTH DAKOTA BOARD OF PHARMACY

The Board of Pharmacy met Sept. 14 in person and via Zoom. SDPhA Executive Board members were present and visited with the Board, as is required annually by our Bylaws.

In addition, Amanda Bacon, Jessica Strobl and Lindsey Riter-Rapp attended a meeting with members of the Board of Pharmacy, as well as the South Dakota Medical Association regarding statute changes seemingly required to facilitate the prior mentioned rules package now on hold. Coming to agreement on key issues particular regarding vaccine administration will require much additional conversation.

NATIONAL COMMUNITY PHARMACISTS ASSOCIATION (NCPA) AND NATIONAL ALLIANCE OF STATE PHARMACY ASSOCIATIONS (NASPA)

In October, Amanda Bacon and Jessica Strobl, SDPhA President attended the annual NCPA Meeting in Orlando Florida. This was the first national meeting attended in person for Bacon since before COVID. NCPA provided great learning opportunities, both in terms of CE, and advocacy. This organization was extremely helpful in our efforts the last 2 years to pass PBM legislation. It was great to be able to finally say an in-person thank you to those who worked so hard for us. The NASPA meeting was also time very well spent. While we meet often via Zoom – just like with our state association meeting – it's jut different when you are all together in the room. The networking and insight gained about the work in other states is extremely important, especially ahead of our legislative session.

FALL DISTRICT MEETINGS

Two districts held Fall District meetings. The Sioux Falls District held its meeting Oct. 16, and the Aberdeen District held its Fall meeting Oct. 23. The Fall meetings are now optional, but we encourage districts to host them if they are able. Both meetings contained update from SDPhA, as well as opportunities to hear from some of our industry partners. The Sioux Falls District has also planned a volunteer event for the holidays. They are seeking volunteers to help gift wrap packages at the Empire Mall to benefit the Children's Inn. We encourage all our districts to engage with the community in these types of events if they are able – they're wonderful opportunities for everyone! Thanks to all who organize these events, as well as those who volunteer.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG ABUSE AND AWARENESS

DEA TAKE-BACK EVENTS

The Fall DEA Take Back Day was Oct. 28, 2023. Please visit

https://www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov/drug_disposal/takeback/ for results information. We continue to work to encourage pharmacist and law enforcement participation in these locally held events. We also continue to work with pharmacists and the BOP to promote the year-round pharmaceutical disposal receptacles. If you have a story you'd like to share about either to aid in that promotion, please contact our office.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG MONITORING PROGRAM

The Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) continues to be an excellent resource for practitioners. South Dakota state law mandates PDMP registration for everyone who has a SD Controlled Substance Registration (SD CSR).

While the Board of Pharmacy is the entity managing the program, an advisory board was established under the law which consists of at least twelve (12) designees. Jessica Strobl serves on SDPhA's behalf on the advisory board and attended the Oct. 17 meeting. The group makes recommendations to the Board of Pharmacy as to how to best use the program to improve patient care and reduce the misuse, abuse, or diversion of controlled substances. The advisory council also makes recommendations to the Board regarding safeguards for release of information to only persons who are entitled access to maintain the confidentiality of program information.

SDPhA has strongly supported the PDMP since its inception and remains a solid supporter of the program.

SOUTH DAKOTA OPIOID ABUSE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This committee met most recently August 24, 2023. The next meeting should be held in December 2023 or January 2024. SDPhA Past President Kristen Carter represents SDPhA. The goal of the group is to review opioid use data for the state and develop strategies for preventing prescription opioid misuse and abuse. According to the National Institute on Drug Abuse, researchers have observed increases in substance abuse and drug overdoses since the COVID-19 pandemic was declared a national emergency. Nationwide, pharmacists continue to engage in the work to prevent prescription drug abuse with the knowledge that real solutions must balance the need for patient access to medications for legitimate medical purposes with the need to prevent diversion and abuse. HEALTH PROFESSIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (HPAP)

The passage of SB4 in 2021 brought changes to some of the requirements for HPAP program administration. We continue to appreciate the open communication with the Board of Pharmacy on what this may mean for the future of the program. Our association continues to support HPAP and saw a decrease from \$20,000 to \$15,000 in the billing for FY 2023-2024. A pharmacist may access the program by self-referral, board referral, or referral from another person or agency, employer, coworker, or family member.

PHARMACY TECHNICIAN UNIVERSITY (PTU)

The SDPhA board is committed to strongly supporting pharmacy technicians, including finding them, training them, and keeping them. We know this is becoming an even more pressing issue now than perhaps ever before.

SDPhA is pleased to continue to offer low-cost access to this online training module. As with everything, user fees increased slightly again in April 2023. SDPhA has now enrolled more than 175 participants. We are also thrilled to report a record-tying 15 student participants enrolled in the DIAL Virtual Program for the 2023-2024 school year. The DIAL program works with high schools throughout South Dakota. We have seen a very exciting increase in the number of students enrolled through Oglala Lakota in particular. We appreciate the pharmacists who have stepped up in communities across the state to work with the DIAL program and these students. This is an exceptional opportunity to introduce the profession into the school systems, and we are grateful for everyone working together who makes it happen.

Just a reminder, the Therapeutic Research Center - PTU 101 module we administer qualifies as a PTCB-Recognized Education/Training Program of the CPhT program, and upon completion, allows participants to sit for the certification exam. In addition to PTU 101, we now offer four additional training modules through TRC:

- PTU Elite: Immunizations
- PTU Elite: Math Mastery Community Pharmacy
- PTU Elite: Compounded Sterile Preparation Technician Program
- PTU Elite: Soft Skills Program.

EDUCATION, COMMUNICATION, PUBLIC AFFAIRS AND PROFESSIONAL RELATIONS

CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Association continues to focus on providing quality continuing education for practitioners. SDPhA continues to work with the SDSU College of Pharmacy to bring you interesting continuing education opportunities at the annual convention and throughout the year. We have also been engaged from time to time to assist pharmaceutical companies in getting the word out on local opportunities for informative programs.

REACHING OUT

The Association prepares and delivers Legislative and Association Updates, CE and pharmacy-related information at Fall and Spring district meetings, in addition to delivering a variety of educational programs at each Annual Convention. The Association continues to work with student pharmacists on the American Pharmacists Month campaign, which helps bring awareness to the state about all pharmacists can do, and how patient care is improved with a pharmacist engaged. SDPhA previously provided SDSU students a grant for, and continues to assist with, pieces related to the, "More Than a Count" campaign. This campaign showcases the profession and SDPhA utilizing traditional and social media platforms to engage both pharmacists throughout the state as well as members of the general public.

THE SOUTH DAKOTA PHARMACIST

Communicating with our members quickly and effectively is extremely critical to the success of the Association. The South Dakota Pharmacist continues a quarterly electronic distribution. You can also find it posted with past issues on our website. It always offers 1.5 hours of CE and provides a source of communication for the association on rules, legislative issues and education that affect pharmacy practice.

WEBSITE UPDATES

The SDPhA website continues to evolve. We were extremely pleased to see that changes made last year to the convention registration pages for both participants and sponsors continue to work well – we had no technical issues with registrations in 2023! Other recent changes include and new <u>PBM and Payer Resource</u> page, and updates to the <u>Pharmacist Wellbeing</u> resource.

We expect even more utilization in 2024 of the new and improved <u>Action Center</u>. We contracted a new service for this area – half the price of the old, and a product better suited to our website and how our pharmacists communicate with their lawmakers. The new process is clearly a success, and we're excited about the customization this platform offers, and how it enhances our communication and messaging opportunities!

SOCIAL MEDIA/EMAIL BLASTS

Enhancing communication will take center stage the remained of 2023 and for the first quarter of 2024. Expect to see more from us in all the areas – as we work to really drill down into the best methods of communication for our pharmacists, technicians, and students. We continue to utilize and expand our social media footprint where appropriate. This presence is something we consider vital to our work of representing the pharmacy profession through advancing patient care, enhancing public awareness, and serving in the best interest of public health and pharmacy.

SCAPP | SDSU APHA - ASP CHAPTER

We continue to work closely with SDSU, and the student pharmacists.
