Who is Pipeline Safety and who is PHMSA?

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South Dakota Pipeline Safety

- Pipeline Safety is a part of the Public Utilities Commission
- Ensure that the <u>intrastate natural gas</u> pipelines in South Dakota operate safety.
 - Intrastate only the pipelines contained within the state
 - Natural Gas pipelines not hazardous liquid pipelines
- Inspect pipelines construction, operations and maintenance to ensure they meet the required regulations.
 - Review records
 - Observe construction
 - Spot check facilities in the field

South Dakota Pipeline Safety

Consists of Two People

- Boice Hillmer, Pipeline Inspector
- There are 13 intrastate natural gas pipeline operators in the state.

South Dakota Pipeline Safety

- State employees but act as an agent for PHMSA.
- Partially funded by a PHMSA pipeline safety grant (up to 80%, but typically about 70%) and the natural gas operators pay the remainder of our costs.
- PHMSA reviews each state pipeline safety program annually to determine program adequacy and adjust funding.
- Damage prevention is one aspect of the regulations that we enforce.
- Also enforce these regulations:
 - Operations and Maintenance
 - Construction
 - Drug and alcohol program
 - Operator qualification program
 - Control room management program
 - Public awareness program
 - Integrity management program

PHMSA - Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety Administration

- Part of the Department of Transportation
- Protect people and the environment
- Safe transportation of energy and other hazardous materials
- Establish national policy
- Sets and enforces standards
- Educates
- Conducts research

PHMSA - Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety Administration

PHMSA - Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety Administration

- PHMSA gets their authorization from Congress.
- Authorization is renewed every 4 years.
- Congress can/will require certain rules be implemented in the reauthorization.
- In the 2006 reauthorization "Pipeline Inspection, Protection, Enforcement, and Safety (PIPES) Act of 2006" revised the federal excavation damage enforcement laws.
- In 2015, 49 CFR 198 was developed to address the requirements in the 2006 reauthorization.
- Rulemaking process includes getting public comment prior to implementation.

PHMSA and Pipeline Safety

- PHMSA also conducts annual reviews of State excavation damage prevention law enforcement programs.
- If State Excavation Damage Prevention considered in adequate pipeline safety could lose up to 4% of its federal funding (approximately \$8,000 annually).
- SDCL <u>49-34B-8</u>. Programs for prevention of damage.
 - The commission shall encourage and promote programs designed to prevent damage to natural gas pipeline facilities as a consequence of demolition, excavation, tunneling, or construction activity.
