SOUTH DAKOTA COMMISSION ON GAMING BOARD OF STEWARDS FORT PIERRE RACETRACK

FINDINGS. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDTIONS

In the Matter of Violations of Racing Medication Rules October 1 and 2, 2022

I. BACKGROUND

Following the running of races at Fort Pierre on October 1 and 2, 2022 the director of the Center For Tox Services, the official racing testing laboratory for the South Dakota Commission on Gaming, notified the Executive Secretary of the Commission that 21 blood samples had levels of permitted medication, mostly phyenlbutazone, which was found to exceed the quantitative limits set forth in South Dakota Commission on Gaming racing rules.

The Executive Secretary informed the Board of Stewards of these findings and scheduled Stewards hearings which were held on November 10, 2022.

The authority of the Stewards to impose penalties for racing rule violations is set by SDCL 42-7-96 to suspend racing licenses for a maximum of four racing days and a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars. This statute also provides "If the racing judges or stewards find that a penalty which exceeds their limits to impose should be rendered, they may not impose any penalty and shall forward their findings and conclusions and recommendations to the commission for final agency action."

In these cases, the penalty limits of the stewards were further limited by ARSD 20:04:27:16 which states "A trainer, owner or veterinarian found guilty of violation any provision of ARSD 20:04:27:14 (the rule that sets restrictions on authorized drugs and which the trainers involved were cited for violating) shall be fined by the board of stewards not more than \$250 or suspended for period of not more than four horse racing days...."

ARSD 20:04:27:12 allows more severe penalties to be imposed in cases where illegal substances are found in blood or urine samples taken from racehorses. The inconsistency between these two rules is a matter which will be addressed in the "Recommendations" section of this document.

The laboratory reports for seven horses indicated medication levels above those set in South Dakota Commission on Gaming racing rules but at levels that, in the opinion of the Board of Stewards, were not extremely above the authorized limit and the Stewards resolved those cases in the hearings that were held on November 10, 2022. In those cases, the Stewards imposed the maximum penalty allowed under ARSD 20:04:27:14, which was a fine of \$250.00.

Because of the high levels of medication detected in the other samples the Stewards have referred those cases to the Commission on Gaming with their Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations, as provided by SDCL 42-7-96.

PHENYLBUTAZONE

Phenylbutazone, commonly known as "bute" has been widely used in racehorses since the late 1970's or early 1980's. It is a pain reliever and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NASID), similar to Ibuprofen for use by humans.

It is typically administered to horses orally but can be injected or applied to the legs by using a paste. The two most common methods of administering the drug orally is to mix "bute " tablets or powder in the horse's feed or to dissolve the tables in water and administer this liquid to the horse, usually by using a large syringe without a needle. Some "old school" trainers will cap one end of a short length of garden hose with paper, break up the tablets, mix the tablet fragments with water inside the hose, insert the open end of the hose into the horse's mouth and "blow" the mixture into the horse's throat.

FLUNIXIN

Flunixin, also known as Banamine, is also a NASID that is used in horses to reduce pain and inflammation. By Federal law this drug can only be used by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian.

ASSOCIATION OF RACING COMMISSIONERS INTERNATIONAL (ARCI) PROCESS FOR DETERMINING THERAPEUTIC MEDICATION GUIDELINES

The South Dakota Commission on Gaming has adopted the Association of Racing Commissioners International most recent Controlled Therapeutic Medication Schedule for Horses, Version 4.2.1 which was most recently revised in December 2020.

This document is reviewed and updated periodically, and therapeutic levels of some drugs are changed from time to time as more research is conducted on the effects of those drugs in racehorses.

The process for changing the document usually starts with recommendations from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC). The RMTC was founded in 2001 with the goal of advancing uniformity in medication policy for racehorses. It is governed by a board of directors representing 23 racing organizations or associations including major horse racetracks, horse owners and trainers, the Racing Commissions International and the Jockeys' Guild.

These recommendations are then presented to the ARCI Model Rules and Practices Committee, which consists of 11 racing commissioners and commission executive directors. This Committee

holds public hearings and take testimony on proposed rule changes from interest persons, usually representing horse owners and trainers, racetrack veterinarians (both regulatory and private practice) and jockeys. Some matters are also vetted by the ARCI's Drug Testing Standards and Procedures Committee, which is comprised of 11 racing commissioners, commission executive directors and commission veterinarians. The Model Rules and Practices Committee's recommendations are then forwarded to the full membership of the ARCI, or its Executive Board for final adoption.

The goal of this process is to develop rules, in a manner that allows representative of all stakeholders to participate, which will allow certain medications to be administered to racehorses but at levels that will not potentially affect the performance of a horse during a race. It is the opinion of the experts involved in the process that drugs that are found in a blood sample above the permitted levels could impact the performance of a horse during a race.

Multiple Medication Violation (MMV) Point System

The ARCI has also developed a "point system" under which trainers receive points upon a finding by a board of stewards or a racing commission that the trainer has violated a medication rule. The license of a trainer who receives five points or more in a one year period can be suspended for a period of 15 to 360 days depending upon the number of points received. The SDCOG has adopted this point system in ARSD 20:04:27:17.

II. FINDINGS

The Board of Stewards submit the following Findings to the Commission pursuant to SDCL 42-7-96.

1) Blood samples taken from seven horses that were trained by Gilbert W. Ecoffey that raced on October 1 and 2, 2022 contained Phyenlbutazone or Flunixin in amounts which exceeded the limits allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.

The names of those horses, the races in which they ran and the amount of Phenylbutazone detected in each blood sample are described in further detail in Stewards Ruling 2022-01-FTP, which is attached hereto as Appendix A.

The blood sample taken from the horse Stern, following the first race on October 2, 2022 contained both Phenylbutazone and Flunixin. The presence of more than one NASID in the same blood sample is a violation of ARSD 20:04:27:14.

Mr. Ecoffey testified that owner Eric Raemaker had recently purchased Stern, and that Stern's previous trainer may have been upset about losing the horse from his or her stable and

administered a large amount of the drug to the horse in an attempt to create a violation if the horse was tested in the near future.

The Stewards find Mr. Ecoffey is responsible for the condition of the horse regardless of the acts of other persons under ARSD 20:04:21:14, which states "The trainer of the horse shall be responsible for and be the absolute insurer of the condition of the horse he enters regardless of the acts of other parties."

Purse money won by those horses trained by Mr. Ecoffey was \$14,895.00.

2) Blood samples taken from three horses trained by Robert Don Johnson contained Phenylbutazone in amounts which exceeded the limits allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.

The names of those horses, the races in which they ran and the amount of Phyenlbutazone found in each blood sample are described in further detail in Stewards Ruling Number2022-03-FTP, which is attached hereto as Appendix B.

Purse money won by those horses trained by Mr. Johnson was \$13,500.00.

Mr. Johnson testified that he did know what the allowable level for bute is under SDCOG rules. It was pointed out that some of the SDCOG medication rules and reference to ARCI Controlled Therapeutic Medication Schedule for Horses Version 4.2.1 was printed in the track's condition book.

Mr. Johnson stated that 1) he did not get a copy of the condition book until after he had entered some of the horses and 2) he did not read the condition book.

The Board of Stewards does not find that testimony credible. Condition books are published by track management at all horse track as the primary method of informing trainers of the types of races which will be run at the track and of track rules. Examples of the type of information contained in the 2022 Condition Book for the Fort Pierre Racetrack are shown in Appendix D.

The Board of Stewards also find Mr. Johnson's testimony that he did not read the condition book to have the same legal weight as a driver who is contesting a speeding ticket telling the Court, "I never read the speed limit signs."

Mr. Johnson testified that Steward Larry Eliason told him the South Dakota limit for bute is "the same as Wyoming." Steward Eliason stated during the hearing that he has no recollection of any such conversation and neither of other two Stewards had any recollection of any such conversation.

3) Blood samples taken from three horses trained by owner/trainer Perry Cavanaugh which raced at Fort Pierre on October 1, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in amounts which exceeded the limits allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.

The names of those horses, the races in which they ran and the amount of Phenylbutazone which was detected in blood samples taken from each horse are described in further detail in Stewards Ruling Number 2022-06 FTP, which is attached hereto as Appendix C.

Purse money won by those horses trained by Mr. Cavanaugh was \$2,575.00.

The Stewards are aware that Robert Johnson and Gilbert W. Ecoffey are professional racehorse trainers who have been licensed and competed in several jurisdictions for decades. These trainers are aware that medication rules, and other racing rules such as restrictions on claimed horses, vary from state to state and that as professionals they are responsible to know and follow the rules at the location(s) at which they are competing.

The "absolute insurer rule" is in force in every US racing jurisdiction and is one of the bedrocks of racing regulation. In South Dakota it is codified as ARSD 20:04:21:14, which states, "The trainer shall be responsible for and be the absolute insurer of the condition of the horse he enters regardless of the acts of other parties."

ARSD 20:04:17:03 states " Every licensee shall make himself aware of any amendments to these rules."

III. RECOMMENDATIONS

Because South Dakota only has one weekend of racing the lab results are not known to the Executive Secretary or the Stewards until after the season is concluded. The short season also makes license suspension by the Stewards not a viable option. A license suspension of four racing days would, in effect, be a suspension of two years which is much more severe than the Stewards believe should be imposed for these offenses.

In normal circumstances the Stewards would deal with offenses such as in these cases by imposing a fine on the trainer involved and disqualifying the horse from first, second or whichever place it ran and redistribute the purse to owners of other horses in that race. In these cases, because of the limit of the Stewards imposed by ARSD 20:04:27:16, which does not provide for disqualification of the horse the Stewards felt that due to the seriousness of these cases the matters should be referred to the Commission for final agency action.

The statutes do not impose a limit on the amount of fine the Commission can impose for violations of racing rules.

The Stewards are aware that the owners have already received the purse money and that the owners are not defendants in these cases. Owners do not administer drugs to horses that are on a racetrack. Trainers do. It is the opinion of the Stewards that a fine of a

significant amount against the trainers involved would send a message to all trainers that such conduct will not be tolerated in South Dakota horse racing in the future.

The ARCI penalty guidelines for these offenses are a minimum fine of \$1,000, disqualification and loss of purse for the horse and the horse must pass an examination by a commission approved veterinarian before being eligible to run. In these cases, disqualification of the horse and redistribution of the purse are not an option because of the penalty limits of ARSD 20:04:27:16.

The Commission can place the horses on a restricted list, known in the industry as a "Vet's List", until such time as it has passed a prerace exam by a veterinarian approved by the Commission. This could be a Racing Commission regulatory veterinarian in another state, if so designated by the Executive Secretary.

In addition to the fines recommended above be imposed on the trainers the Stewards recommend the Commission authorize the Executive Secretary to place the horses involved on a restricted list until it has passed an examination by a commission approved veterinarian.

The Stewards recognize that while these cases involve multiple violations they all occurred during one weekend. Because of that the trainers were not notified of the violations in time to withdraw their horses from a race or make changes to their medication practices. For these reasons the Stewards recommend that the Commission assign each trainer only ½ point in total for these violations for purposes of the MMV point system.

The long-term solution to resolve situations such as this without a hearing before the Commission is to repeal ARSD 20:24:17:16. That would allow penalties for improper use of authorized medications to be handled under ARSD 20:25:17:12 and SDCL 42-7-96 which give the Stewards much more latitude, especially when dealing with the disqualification of a horse. The Stewards realize that this is a subject for discussion at a future Commission meeting.



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STEWARDS RULING NUMBER 2022-01-FTP



The Board of Stewards of the Fort Pierre Racetrack has determined that the blood samples taken from:

- 1) Dance for Ransom for the first (1st) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 1, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in the amount of 1.5 microgram/milliliter. This is five (5)times the amount allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 2) Maximus the Great for the second (2nd) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 1, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in the amount of .6 microgram/milliliter. This is two (2) times the amount allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 3) New Gospel for the fourth (4th) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 1, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in the amount of 2.4 microgram/milliliter. This is eight (8) times the allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 4) Pref Right for the sixth (6th) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 1, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in the amount of 2.0 microgram/milliliter. This is more than six (6) times the amount allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 5) Goodnightsugar for the sixth (6th) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 1, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in the amount of 2.8 microgram/milliliter. This is 9.3 times the amount allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 6) Stern for the first (1st) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 2, 2022 contained Phenylbutazone in the amount of 4.7 microgram/milliliter. This is more than fifteen (15) times the amount allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 7) Stern for the first (1st) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 2, 2022 contained Flunixin in the amount of 10 nanograms/milliliter. This is two (2) times the amount allowed by ARSD 20:04:27:14.
- 8) Stern for the (1st) race at the Fort Pierre Racetrack on October 2, 2022 contained Flunixin and Phenylbutazone. Per ARSD 20:04:27:14 only one NSAID may be used.



The following rules regarding medications and penalties Effective August 9, 2022 as follows:

20:04:27:12. Penalty for use of illegal substances. The stewards and the commission shall consider all points for violations in all racing jurisdictions as contained in the trainer's official record maintained by the Association of Racing Commissioners International.

In addition to the penalty imposed for the underlying offense the following enhancements shall be imposed upon a trainer based on the cumulative points contained in the trainer's record of violations maintained by the Association of Racing Commissioners International.

Points	Suspension in days
5 to 5.5	15 to 30
6 to 8.5	30 to 60
9 to 10.5	90 to 180
11 or more	180 to 360

The stewards and the commission shall consider aggravating and mitigating circumstances including the trainer's prior record of medication violations when determining the penalty for a violation of these rules.

Multi-medication violation points are intended to be a separate and additional penalty to be imposed upon a trainer who has a pattern of violations.

The stewards or commission ruling shall distinguish between the penalty for the underlying offense and any enhancement penalty based on a stewards or commission review of the trainer' cumulative record of violations.

This statement is in response to the complaint filed by the South Dakota Commission on Gaming dated November 9, 2022, alleging violation of ARSD 20:18:12.01:23: Age of participants and SDCL 42-7B-35: Age of participants –Violation as misdemeanor. Cadillac Jacks acknowledges that on the afternoon of October 30th, 2022, a 20-year-old and 19-year-old male, both from Mexico, entered Cadillac Jack's, and played slot machines, and loitered in the gaming area in violation of ARSD 20:18:12.01:23, and SDCL 42-7B-35.

On the day in question, Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort had multiple licensed employees on site. Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort acknowledges that the violation occurred, and that staff members failed to recognize the 20-year-old and 19-year-old as underage gamblers loitering in the gaming area.

The day floor staff believed the individuals were part of a group of Hispanic construction workers that frequent the resort to dine at Guadalajara's Mexican Restaurant and gamble during the week. These individuals are of legal age to participate in gaming activities. Staff believed these individuals were part of this group and were twenty-one years of age or older. This was a case of mistaken identity; the two individuals who are regular players with similar characteristics are of age to participate in gaming.

The violation was discovered by the cocktail server that came on duty for the night shift, who was not familiar with the group that frequently visit during the day. The cocktail server identified the individuals when making her first initial round of cocktails. The cocktail server asked for identification, and the person produced a Mexican identification which verified that they were not of legal age to gamble in

South Dakota. She then notified the floor supervisor of the incident. Cadillac Jack's floor supervisors self-reported to the Commission this violation upon discovery by a cocktail server while in the performance of her duties.

Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort has taken steps to hire additional floor staff because of the latest incident. The job title for the newly created staff position is Floor Greeter/Age Compliance. They will not be performing any other duties other than checking identification of gaming patrons that appear under the age of thirty. We will be utilizing the additional staff during peak times, weekends, and evenings with adjustments to schedules as needed all while maintaining our existing procedures for identification and ensuring compliance.

Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort has also rehired a floor supervisor with a law enforcement background. He will assist with staff training and compliance. His projected start date November 21st, 2022.

Cadillac Jacks Gaming Resort has continued ongoing communications with licensed and unlicensed staff members on being in control of the gaming floor, walking into gaming rooms to observe who we have on the floor as well as checking identification and keeping minors moving through the gaming floor.

Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort has an incentive program that rewards staff with a \$200 bonus for identifying underage gambling and fraudulent identification.

We have increased large signage throughout the casino floor and adjacent non-gaming areas. This has had a positive impact on awareness to our guests, and with minors going through the casino. These signs read "SOUTH DAKOTA STATE LAW MUST BE 21 TO GAMBLE. UNDER 21 DO NOT LOITER PLEASE KEEP MOVING THROUGH THE CASINO FLOOR". Cadillac Jacks is in the process of updating the signage with a more powerful message, to include you will be arrested. <u>See attached for signage placements</u>.

Cadillac Jack's is also in the process of creating additional game level notifications in English and Spanish. "UNDER 21? IT'S NOT WORTH THE GAMBLE YOU WILL BE ARRESTED"

Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort also has multiple signs in Spanish on the age of participants requirement.

Cadillac Jack's Gaming Resort takes these violations that occurred very seriously and have taken the above additional steps to ensure compliance, we have and will continue to be communicating with our staff the importance of complying with all rules and regulations of the Commission on Gaming.

Dear Mrs. Christian:

The Mineral Palace has received a copy of the proposed rule changes for Gaming Rules: ARSD 20:18:12.01:16 and ARSD 20:18:12.01:23. We understand that minors on casino floors throughout Deadwood was a problem this past summer. Notifying customers as they enter our building and training our staff; we feel has helped in the minor situation. If the proposed rules are implemented, the impact will be financially devastating on businesses within Deadwood. The Mineral Palace would like to see the current written rules remain the same.

Deadwood has a strong peak season and a slow shoulder season. If these rules were to pass as written the property owners throughout Deadwood would need to take on the burden of hiring new personnel. For the Mineral Palace, we operate with 12 retail licenses and to comply with the rule as it is proposed, we would need to hire an additional 12 full time employees and 12 part-time employees. We estimate these new employees would be compensated at minimum of \$15/hour. This would add approximately \$561,600 to payroll. The estimate cost of labor does not include taxes or additional benefits the company offers its employees. Without a guarantee of additional revenue to offset the expense, we are potentially driving the company in the red.

We foresee businesses throughout Deadwood would need to be creative to survive. Potentially gaming devices would need to be pulled off casino floors, tables removed from casinos, hotel rooms blocked to limit the amount of people on property or more restaurants limiting hours or closing because of staffing. The impact would be detrimental to many local businesses in Deadwood including the Mineral Palace.

Since August 2022, the Mineral Palace feels that by making the public aware of the SD laws, training staff members and repeating the training; we can continue to monitor the gaming floor and remain in compliance. We understand that in peak times additional staff is needed to help monitor the gaming floor. As more time is given to operators they will find ways to make sure that the gaming floor is monitored. Every business is unique and by placing a requirement of staff based on gaming retail licenses is unreachable without causing financial distress on a number of entities.

Mineral Palace Hotel & Gaming



The Mineral Palace does not approve minors gambling on casino floors, we would like to keep the town a family friendly destination as it was originally created. Instead of creating an adversarial environment, let's try and foster one of cooperation and teamwork.

In closing, the Mineral Palace is hopeful that the South Dakota Commission on Gaming can reconsider the proposed rules and keep the current rules in place with no changes. Every business in Deadwood is unique in its own way and each business should have the right to hire the amount of staff they need to operate their business and remain in compliance with the SDCG rules and regulations.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Wagner at 9:00 a.m. and a quorum was present.

Administrative Hearing

The court reporter for the hearing was Tina Pruss. The following cases were scheduled to be heard:

- > In the matter of one (1) seized slot machine
- > SDCG vs DHIH, LLC dba as Hickok's
- SDCG vs Mustang Sally and SDCG vs Jennifer Haefs

Chairman Wagner served as the hearing officer.

The Matter of One Virus Shock Slot Machine

The purpose of the hearing is to determine if the Virus Shock slot machine No. 2125000, U-4 000732, serial number 002527, which was seized from 814 Main Street, Gregory, South Dakota on June 9, 2022, is contraband and may be destroyed. Tera Kiley was served notice of the hearing by certified mail but was not present. The decision on this matter was deferred to Executive Session.

DHIH, LLC dba Hickok's

Present for the hearing representing DHIH, LLC was Nick Moser, Attorney. This hearing is a contested case alleging grounds for disciplinary action alleging that on January 30, 2022, Hickok Casino allowed patrons to place sports wagers with other patrons at the Hickok Casino while in the bar area. Hickok Casino does not have approved sports wagering therefore the bets were in violation of SDCL 22-25-1. The decision on this matter was deferred to Executive Session.

Mustang Sally Jennifer Haefs

Present for the hearing representing Mustang Sally and Jennifer Haefs was Roger Tellinghuisein, Attorney. Toby Keehn, owner of Mustang Sally, was present and waived his 5th amendment rights and testified on his own behalf. Jennifer Haefs was present but invoked her 5th Amendment privilege and did not testify. The hearing was a contested case pursuant to an Initial Compliant alleging grounds for disciplinary action as a result of knowingling placing and accepting proxy sports wagers, allowing the owner to participate in gaming on his own premises and as a proxy for individuals, and extending credit for the purpose of sports wagering. Staff recommended that the license's for Mustang Sally be revoked with a fine and the license for Jennifer Haefs be revoked with a fine. The decision on this matter was deferred to Executive Session.

A brief recess was taken at 10:57 a.m. and resumed at 11:07 a.m.

The hearing portion of the meeting was concluded at 11:29 a.m.

General Meeting

Chairman Wagner called the general meeting to order at 11:30 a.m.

Adoption of Quarterly Business Meeting Agenda

Commissioner Goetz made a motion to approve the meeting agenda. Vice Chairman Fischer seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

June 22, 2022, Quarterly Meeting

Commissioner Hawley made a motion to adopt the minutes as drafted for the June 22, 2022, quarterly meeting. Commissioner Goetz seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Old Business

• Under 21 years of age on the Casino's gaming floor

Chairman Wagner stated that there was an old business item to be discussed regarding the underage gaming. This was an issue that was brought forth and discussed at the June 22nd meeting. At that point in time the industry had asked that we allow them the opportunity to make some changes and corrections, and to deal with resolving the issue of the underage individuals that are on the gaming floor. At this point we will have the staff provide comments, then will take comments from the industry, and then we will ask questions.

Staff Comments

Susan Christian, Executive Secretary, stated that since the June 22nd meeting this is what was identified:

- 16 minors were on the gaming floor for more than a few minutes
- In 2022 there were 84 fake IDs identified and were reported to the police department and 82 of them were identified by Saloon #10
- 3 minors were arrested for participating in gambling
- 2 minors had fake IDs; 2 minors were stopped before they participated in gambling
- 1 minor put money in a machine, but it didn't accept the bill and an agent had approached the individual

Since the August 18th meeting with the industry one incident in a casino did occur and resulted in an informal consultation. In lite of that we have observed the industry step up by putting up signs, two places have put out formal polices to their employees, casinos are having meetings with staff instructing them to more actively engage and to be actively engaged in checking IDs. Casinos seem to be more actively engaged for checking IDs for alcohol than for the gambling.

Mark Heltzel, Deputy Executive Secretary, stated that he was seeing an upswing in signage around town, posters, found 6 minors that attempted or tried to gamble, casinos are reworking the gaming floor and roping off the floor for families. Actively engaged in checking IDs for gaming is not at the same level as for checking IDs for alcohol.

Comments by the Industry

Roger Tellinghusien, representing the Deadwood Gaming Association, addressed the Commission that this is a signification topic of conversation amongst the casino managers and owners. The industry has taken this to heart and are trying to make positive changes, more signage, more staffing, and as importantly education of staff and impart the significant of the need to follow through. There were a lot of people in Deadwood at times for special events. There are going to be occasions where an underage individual is on the floor that doesn't get caught. There needs to be consequences for the ones that break the law. The industry will continue to address the issue.

Staff Comments

Deputy Executive Heltzel stated that the underage individuals are arrested, taken to jail, and charged with a misdemeanor.

Commissioner Christianson stated that there are two concerns underage gambling, and underage minors on the gaming floor with parents.

Chairman Wagner stated that the bottom line is that we are going into 90 days and the Commission was expecting more than just a conversation as we are still seeing the types of individuals on the floor. The underage and kids those are issues and concerns. How many of the casinos have added staff for security for more than just special events.

Deputy Secretary Heltzel stated that the Commission on Gaming along with the Deadwood police department on October 4, 2022, are presenting an ID class and there are currently 200 signed up for the class.

Chairman Wagner stated that are often hearing comments that as long as the minor is three feet from the machine then it is okay for them to be in the vicinity. There are employees that still may be operating under that thought process. This is not in the rule and needs to be put forth to employees that it is not an option and minors need to be off the floor. So, in looking at the rules as they currently stand, do they provide enough clarity.

Executive Secretary Christian stated that rule 20:18:12.01:23 Age of participants, has a lot of ambiguity in the rule as loitering and exceptions cause problems. The rule 20:18:12.01:16 Premise monitoring required, came into effect in 1998 and has never been looked at. This rule needs to be definitive. Casinos are unable to have ample coverage with the monitors in the cage or bar area. The ambiguity of the rule is very difficult, and it puts the industry and the commission at odds.

Deputy Executive Secretary Hetzel stated that some places put up monitors in the cashier cage, but the problem is how do you monitor the floor and take care of customers.

Chairman Wagner directed staff to move forward and look at the rules and to have something for the December meeting. Staff will work with the industry when going through the rules.

Remarks by Executive Secretary

Susan Christian, Executive Secretary, gave a brief report on the following items:

- Executive Secretary Christian, Commissioner Wagner, Commissioner Hawley, and Deputy Executive Secretary, Mark Heltzel will be attending G2E in October
- Topics at G2E will be crypto currency, cashless wagering, sports wagering, and a new concept of sports wagering based on the stock market
- A reminder to the industry of the ID training on October 4th and that the training will be repeated if needed

Stipulation and Assurance of Voluntary Compliance

BY Development, dba Cadillac Jack's Gaming

A monetary penalty of \$2,500.00 to be paid not later than September 26, 2022, was imposed for a complaint that was filed alleging that the Defendant engaged in conduct constituting grounds for disciplinary action by allowing on August 5, 2022, an underage person to participate in gaming by playing a slot machine. This is in violation of 42-7B-35. The complaint further alleged that during this period of time there was not an employee who was in full view and control of the gaming being operated. This is in violation of 42-7B-40. An informal consultation was held, and licensee agreed to the penalty and paid the fine.

Commissioner Christianson made a motion to accept the Stipulation and Assurance of Voluntary Compliance and the imposed penalty. Commissioner Goetz seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Super G Investments, dba Silverado/Franklin

A monetary penalty of \$2,500.00 to be paid not later than September 26, 2022, was imposed for a complaint that was filed alleging that the Defendant engaged in conduct constituting grounds for disciplinary action by allowing on August 19, 2022, an underage person to participate in gaming by playing a slot machine. This is in violation of 42-7B-35. The complaint further alleged that during this period of time there was not an employee who was in full view and control of the gaming being operated. This is in violation of 42-7B-40. An informal consultation was held, and licensee agreed to the penalty and paid the fine.

Vice Chairman Fischer made a motion to accept the Stipulation and Assurance of Voluntary Compliance and the imposed penalty. Commissioner Christianson seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Commissioner Christianson stated that its important that we keep these fines reasonable when they are self-reporting. We want to encourage self-reporting. Chairman Wagner commented that she appreciates the fact that they did self-report.

Andrea Speiser

A monetary penalty of \$100.00 to be paid not later than September 26, 2022, was imposed for a complaint that was filed alleging that the Defendant engaged in conduct constituting grounds for disciplinary action by accepting wagers in amounts over the posted 3 Card Poker maximum bet limit. An informal consultation was held, and licensee agreed to the penalty and paid the fine.

Commissioner Hawley made a motion to accept the Stipulation and Assurance of Voluntary Compliance and the imposed penalty. Commissioner Goetz seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Revocation of License Steve Aristide

On August 31, 2022, Steve Aristide voluntarily surrendered his gaming license after pleading guilty to a Class 5 Felony. On August 23, 2022, Licensee received an Order Suspending Imposition of Sentence with two years (2) probation. Staff recommended to revoke his license and that he be put on the Exclusion List. Mr. Aristide was not present at the meeting.

Vice Chairman Fischer made a motion to revoke his license. Commissioner Goetz seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Commissioner Christianson made a motion to put Steve Aristide on the Exclusion List. Commissioner Hawley seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

- Report all disciplinary action taken against Applicant by any regulatory agency and providing updates to Commission staff as to the status of any disciplinary action,

Commissioner Goetz made a motion to go into Executive Session. Vice Chairman Fischer seconded the motion which carried unanimously.
