19 **Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, and Roll Call:**

21 The South Dakota Board of Education Standards (BOES) was called to order by President Sly at  
22 approximately 9:21 a.m. CT.

24 A quorum of board was present.

26 **Adoption of Agenda:**

28 Motion by Nebelsick second by Heineman to adopt the October 25, 2021, agenda. Voice vote. All  
29 present voted in favor. Motion carried. Voting aye: Heineman, Olsen, Nebelsick, Westra, Willard,

32 **Approval of Minutes:**

34 Motion by Heineman second by Olsen to approve the October 18, 2021, minutes Voice vote. All

46 **Standards Revision Timeline:**

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48 Tiffany Sanderson, Secretary DOE, presented proposed changes to the Standards Revision  
49 Timeline.

50

51 Sanderson began with an update regarding proposed Social Studies Standards by referencing the  
52 Governor's press release of October 1, 2021. As per the press release the Department will  
53 restart the Social Studies Standards revision in November/December 2021 with the formation of  
54 a Social Studies Standards revision committee. The Committee and the Department will work to  
55 outline required content by discipline and expectations for learning over the summer of 2022.  
56 The standards will then move to the public hearings process in September 2022 through March  
57 of 2023. After the process concludes and final standards are adopted professional development  
58 for teachers, curriculum directors, and administrators will be held throughout the 2023-2024  
59 school year. Full implementation of the standards would begin in August of 2024.

60

61 Sanderson presented amendments to the Standards Revision Timeline.

62

63 Motion by Olsen and second by Guffin to approve the amendments to the Standards Revision  
64 Timeline as presented. Voice vote. All present voted in favor. Motion Carries. Voting Aye:  
65 Heineman, Olsen, Nebelsick, Westra, Willard, Guffin, and Sly.

67 **Public Hearing-Standards: Fine Arts and Career & Technical Education: Agriculture Food and  
68 Natural Resources; Arts, A/V Technology & Communication; Finance Career; Health Science;  
69 Human Services; and Manufacturing.**

70

71 The Board convened a public hearing at approximately 9:47 a.m. CT. on the following proposed  
72 standards: Fine Arts, and Career & Technical Education: Agriculture Food and Natural Resources;  
73 Arts, A/V Technology & Communication; Finance Career; Health Science; Human Services; and  
74 Manufacturing. This is the first of four hearings on these standards.

76 **Fine Arts Standards**

78 Proponent Testimony

79

80 Vera Tipton, Administrator, Office of Standards, Learning and Leadership, DOE, gave an overview  
81 of the proposed Fine Arts Standards revisions and a summary of public comments that were  
82 received. DOE convened a Fine Arts Standards revision workgroup to review the Fine Arts  
83 standards. The workgroup represented public and private school districts, university faculty, and  
84 other stakeholders. They met via ZOOM seven times between June 21, 2021, and July 19, 2021.

85

86 Tipton stated that as of October 14, 2021, there were seven public comments received. Overall,  
87 the comments were in support of the changes, with some minor editorial changes and potential

88 additions for enhancement of the standards . Comments 1, 2, 4, and 6 will be taken back to the  
89 workgroup for consideration.

90  
91 Boyd Perkins, Coordinator of Fine Arts, Sioux Falls School District and Fine Arts Standards  
92 Revision Workgroup Member testified in favor of the Fine Arts proposed standards.

98 **Career and Technical Education (CTE) Standards**

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100 Laura Scheibe, Director, Division of College, Career, and Student Success, DOE, provided a short  
101 overview of the process used to revise the Career and Technical Education (CTE) standards.

103 **Agriculture Food and Natural Resources (AFNR)**

105 Proponent Testimony

107 Scheibe testified in favor of the proposed Agriculture Food and Natural Resources standards.

108  
109 Scheibe stated that there were six public comments to date on the proposed AFNR standards.  
110 One of those noted the standards would keep students up to date with industry. Four  
111 referenced the newly added Supervised Ag Experience (SAE) standards. The final comment  
112 related to AFNR noted that the standards in Ag Metal Fabrication relate closely to two course  
113 standards on welding in Manufacturing and suggests that this course be added to Manufacturing  
114 to create a welding pathway. This suggestion was sent to the Manufacturing work group, and it  
115 is incorporated in the Manufacturing cluster before you.

191 **Distance Learning Report**

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193 Jennifer Tschetter, Assistant Administrator Office of Assessment & Accountability, Division of  
194 Learning and Instruction, DOE, presented a Distance Learning report.

195  
196 **Black Hills State University - Educator Preparation Advanced Program Approval**

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198 Kathy Riedy, Administrator of Accreditation, division of Accreditation and certification. DOE,  
199 gave a summary regarding the Black Hills State University - Educator Preparation Advanced Program  
200 Approval request

201  
202 Reidy stated that Black Hills State University underwent a Council for the Accreditation of Educator  
203 Preparation (CAEP) accreditation review in April 2018. In October of 2018 CAEP approved accreditation  
204 for their initial level programs. The BOES also approved the accreditation of those program at that time.  
205 When that review took place, CAEP was newly formed and did not have a process in place to review  
206 advanced level programs. They now do. Educator Preparation Programs (EPP) that were reviewed before  
207 this process was finalized were informed that they would have to submit to an interim review of those  
208 advanced programs. Black Hills State (BHSU) fell into this category. In April 2021 BHSU underwent a  
209 successful interim review of their advanced program, Masters of Education in Reading. The CAEP Council  
210 met in August of 2021 and awarded the advanced program full accreditation with no areas for  
211 Improvement or Stipulations.

212  
213 Going forward both initial programs and advanced programs will be reviewed at the same time. BHSU is  
214 scheduled for a full review in Spring 2025.

215  
216 Reidy recommended that the Board accept the CAEP approval and grant BHSU full accreditation through  
217 fall of 2025.

218

219 Motion by Guffin second by Heineman to accept the CAEP decision. Voice vote. All present voted in  
220 favor. Motion Carries. Voting Aye: Heineman, Olsen, Nebelsick, Westra, Willard, Guffin, and Sly.

221  
222 Motion by Olsen second by Nebelsick to approve BHSU's advanced program accreditation through fall  
223 2025 Voice vote. All present voted in favor. Motion Carries. Voting Aye: Heineman, Olsen,  
224 Nebelsick, Westra, Willard, Guffin, and Sly.
