41	Diane Rov. Ge	eneral Counsel, DOE gave an update on a few pertinent events that have occurred
42	•	rd met in May and approved the Medical Cannabis and School rules:

- (1) The Department of Health's (DOH) Medical Cannabis rules are still in draft form and
   they are not set to go into effect until late October this year, that may affect the Medical
   Cannabis and Schools rules before you today, and depending on any future legislative
   actions taken, we may need to revise these rules again.
- 47 (2) The Marijuana Opportunity Reinvestment and Expungement Act (MORES Act) was
   48 recently reintroduced in Congress, –which if passed, would federally legalize cannabis by
   49 removing it from the federal Controlled Substances Act.
- (3) June 23, 2021, the South Dakota Board of Regents considered how the Medical
  Cannabis Law would affect their policies as they apply to the state's higher education
  campuses. Their June agenda states that the proposed revisions to their policies solidify
  the Board's prohibition on the use or possession of marijuana, including medical
  marijuana, on property owned or controlled by the Board or at events hosted or
  sponsored by the Board of any of its institutions. It further states the policy revisions
  ensure compliance with federal authority.
- 57 (4) July 1, 2021, the Medical Cannabis Law 34-20G went into effect, although as Roy stated
  58 earlier, the DOH administrative rules are not in effect until October.
- (5) The South Dakota Highway Patrol issued program implementation guidance regarding
   the enforcement of those in possession of medical cannabis after July 1, 2021. Specific
   provisions of the guidance can be found on medcannabis.sd.gov.
- (6) July 1, 2021, the Flandreau Santee Sioux Tribe opened the first cannabis dispensary in
   South Dakota and is issuing their own ID cards.

Roy went on to update the board on the status of these rules in the rule-making process. At the May 17, 2021, board meeting, the Medical Cannabis and Schools Rules were presented and passed unanimously. The rules were then presented at the June 7, 2021, Interim Rules Review Committee (IRRC) hearing. The IRRC reverted the rules and requested amendments from DOE. DOE was not required to bring the amendments back to the BOES but did so to ensure full transparency in the process and to allow education stakeholders to weigh in before going back to IRRC.

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74 75 Roy added that as per SDCL 1-26-4.10 a new, formal public hearing and public comment period is not required with reverted rules. The board will review the revised draft today and if approved the rules will be resubmitted to the IRRC for hearing on July 19, 2021. Today's board meeting allows the BOES to act on the proposed amendments from DOE within the rules process.

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- Amanda LaCroix, Assistant General Counsel, DOE presented the specific revisions to the rules. Some of the changes are the chapter titles from "General provisions" to "Mandatory district provisions," and "District discretion" to "Permissive district policy". The addition of a definition of "school district", that only public school districts, not non-public schools, will be affected by the rules. The word marijuana was changed to cannabis, and file was changed to educational record to have consistent language. Other revisions to the rules include that school districts
- 84 may provide storage or administer medical cannabis to a student and school personnel may

85	volunteer to store and administer medical cannabis in a non-smokable form to any student
86	cardholder, and that policies may also set parameters for student participation in school-
87	sponsored activities or educational tasks that may put the student or others in an unsafe
88	environment or potentially cause disruption. Nothing in the rules requires school personnel to
89	administer medical cannabis.
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91	LaCroix stated that these revisions are based on IRRC comments and proposed amendments.
