LTSS Service Delivery

- Serve individuals 60 and older & adults age 18 and older with a qualifying disability
- HOPE Waiver, LTSS In-Home Program, Medicaid State Plan, and Older Americans Act (OAA) funding
- 100 LTSS staff located in 20 local offices across the state
- Dakota at Home – intake call center
